# What is breast cancer?

Breast cancer is a disease in which abnormal cells develop in one or both breasts

# How can you reduce your risk for breast cancer?

- Stay at a healthy weight.
- Keep physically active.
- Limit red and processed meats.
- Eat plenty of colorful fruits and vegetables.
- Avoid over consuming sugar-sweetened beverages.

# Risk Factors for breast cancer

- Age: Mostly found in females aged 55 or older.
- Inheriting gene changes: Inherited gene changes, like BRCA1 and BRCA2, can raise risk.
- Having dense breast tissue: Having dense breast tissue makes the chance of getting breast cancer higher. This is because cancers are more difficult to see on mammograms.

# Screening for breast cancer

A mammogram is a special x-ray of the breast to check for breast cancer before any symptoms appear.

### **Guidelines recommended:**

Women should start having mammograms at age 40 and get them yearly. If you have a family history, you may need to start earlier. Complete the assessment using the QR code on the left to find out if you're at increased risk for breast cancer.




# Shining Bright in Pittsburgh at the 19th Annual Mobile Health Clinics Conference

### **Overview**



The sessions were open to participants aged 18 and above. COE collaborated with local community groups and organizations to leverage their networks, ensuring a varied participant pool for the listening sessions. Notably, Sylvester's Community Advisory Committee members played a crucial role in recruiting participants from the target areas who offered valuable feedback on cancer risk, outcomes, and priorities.

- Diverse session formats: Inperson meetings for small groups and virtual sessions for remote participation
- 90-minute duration for each session
- Participants received tokens of appreciation
- Skilled facilitators led the discussions
- Key themes and findings were recorded by scribes

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# ZERO Prostate Cancer, in collaboration with Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center, part of UHealth – University of Miami Health System co-host a free Prostate Cancer Education & Screening Event.

In a remarkable effort to champion men's health, Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center partnered with ZERO Prostate Cancer, a leading advocacy organization, to co-host a transformative Prostate Cancer Education and Screening Event on September 16, 2023, at the Haitian Evangelical Baptist Church led by Pastor David Eugene. This event marked a milestone in the pursuit of early detection and underscored our unwavering commitment to our community's well-being.

Dr. Brandon Mahal, a key expert involved in the Prostate Cancer Education & Screening Event, provided valuable insights into the impact of community events like this, engaging moments with the audience, and practical advice for readers. Dr. Mahal emphasized the importance of community events in building trust and sharing vital knowledge with communities, especially those most affected by specific cancers like prostate cancer. This event, held in a community significantly impacted by prostate cancer, aimed to provide essential information about screening, diagnosis, and treatment. During this event, we were able to screen over 25 community members. Dr. Mahal highlighted that bringing healthcare services to the community demonstrates care and has the potential to save lives.

He emphasized three key points: the importance of early screening for early cancer detection, the availability of advanced diagnostic tests such as MRIs and prostate-specific PET scans, and the existence of various treatment options that can lead to a cure.

This collaborative event brought together experts from Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center, part of UHealth – University of Miami Health System, renowned for its pioneering cancer research and compassionate care. Attendees had the opportunity to engage with medical professionals, ask questions, and gain a deeper understanding of prostate cancer, its risk factors, and the importance of early detection.

Highlighting our dedication to accessible healthcare, this event offered free prostate cancer screenings to eligible male participants. Early detection is a critical factor in successfully managing prostate cancer, and these screenings provided an essential step toward achieving that goal.

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# CAC MEMBER SPOTLIGHT CENTER FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING OF THE KEYS

The Center for Independent Living of the Keys (CIL of the Keys) is one of <u>over 400 Centers for</u> <u>Independent Living</u> (CIL) in the United States. Centers for Independent Living (CIL) are nonresidential, cross-disability, grassroots, nonprofit advocacy organizations. CILs are unique, in that they exist to increase access, self-sufficiency, and equal opportunity for people with disabilities while being designed and operated by people with disabilities.

CIL of the Keys is governed by an active 7-member volunteer board of directors and specialized staff both formed by 51% of people with all types of disabilities who have diverse expertise, and include representation from minority and underserved populations. Today, CIL of the Keys has advanced to become a well-established organization serving more than 1,200 people with disabilities yearly, many receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefits.

CIL of the Keys programs are free to anyone, of any age, who self-identifies as having a disability and lives in Monroe County, Florida.

CIL of the Keys provides support to people with disabilities in the form of advocacy, resources, and information so that they can live their lives with the greatest degree of independence they desire.
